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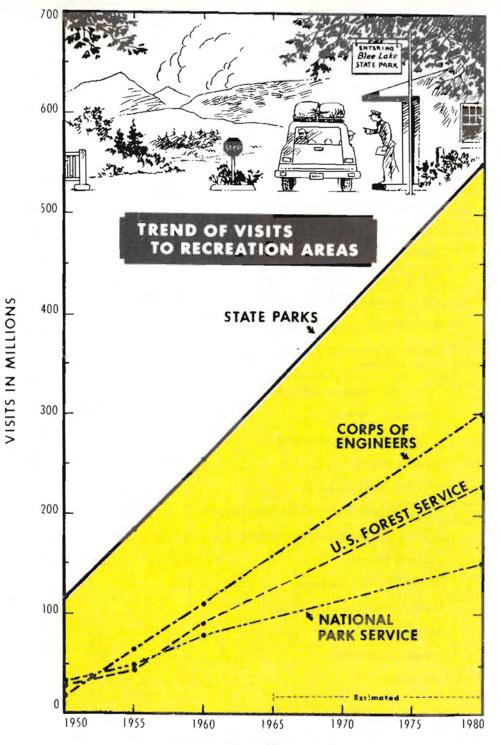

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HISTORICAL BACKGROUND

The ropidly increasing demand for recreation opportunities in urban oreos led Division of Londs personnel to examine Stote land holdings in the Anchorage Service Area for the possibility of developing a multi-activity family recrection areo.

Such on areo would be water-oriented and should provide a voriety of octive recreation opportunities. A year round family type development was indicated in an area large enough to provide many diversified activities-where there would be available quality outdoor recreation experiences for each member of the family during all seasons of the year.

The search rapidly centered on the Noncy Lake - Red Shirt Loke area. This lake area, being the least developed with private holdings and the last availoble lond of its type in the Service Area, appeared to have the desirable elements needed. After considerable study some tentative boundaries were drown, a possible development layout prepared, and the package was presented to the Motanuska - Susitna Borough for consideration. Their reaction was enthusiostic.

A bill was introduced in the legislature, and upon its passage, the State's first large recreation area became a reality.

Som L. Huddleston and Associates of Denver was retained to prepare a master development plan program and budget for this area. Their report is presented herewith.
